Your application will be reviewed ONLY when we have received all of your credentials. If you are transferring from another college, your admission to NJIT must be verified before your Albert Dorman Honors College transfer application can be reviewed.

YOUR TRANSFER APPLICATION MUST CONTAIN ALL OF THE FOLLOWING CREDENTIALS:

- College transcript (if transferring from outside NJIT)
- Professor's recommendation letter (on letterhead stationery)
- Transfer essay for Albert Dorman Honors College

To be fully considered, you should submit an unofficial copy of ALL documents directly to the Honors College.

ESSAY TOPIC FOR TRANSFER APPLICANTS (Including Current NJIT Students)

Write an essay in which you give a specific and definite plan for your Honors education at NJIT. Your essay must cover the following points: (1) any Honors courses you have taken and specific courses you plan to take; (2) research, internships, or similar projects you have completed and those in which you specifically plan to participate; (3) service and other activities within NJIT or your current college in which you have participated, mentioning specifically those you would like to continue or begin; and (4) your plans to undertake other educational opportunities such as a minor or second major. The essay should provide details about how membership in the Honors College will help you attain academic and professional excellence. **This essay is a critical part of your application.**

In addition to the essay, please attach a separate sheet that lists:

- Extracurricular, community, and other service activities in which you have engaged
- Any projects and research related to your curriculum in which you have engaged
- Any Honors courses taken and grades achieved. Distinguish between those taken at NJIT and those taken elsewhere

We encourage you to submit all of the above documents at the same time. All documents must be submitted to the Albert Dorman Honors College by the deadline listed on our website: honors.njit.edu/admission/cc-student.php.

Only those who meet the following requirements are considered for transfer admission. Current first year freshmen (NJIT or other college) must complete at least TWO SEMESTERS of study prior to submitting their transfer application.

- Full-time students should have completed (if required upon admission to NJIT) Math 107, 108, and/or HUM 099/100
- Have taken 15 or more credits each semester (one semester of 12-15 credits is allowed)
- Have a minimum cumulative GPA of at least 3.6
- Earned a B or better in any Honors courses taken
- Have a **minimum of four full semesters** remaining to complete their NJIT degree
- Have taken part in university or community service activities or research.

In short, we ask applicants to the Honors College to have achieved the same level of excellence as those currently in the program.

Due to the high volume of transfer applicants, we are unable to provide individual feedback. Only candidates selected for an interview will be contacted by the Honors College, typically within two weeks of verification of NJIT acceptance and review of completed application packet.
